2017 Highlights

HOME AND FAMILY

Expanded "Preventative Aftercare" in-home services to several northern and southern Colorado counties in response to their requests.

Customized our "Supervised Visitation" services to fit a wide range of ages, needs and court-related circumstances.

Launched "Family Resilience Training" approach to assisting families in crisis and at-risk for separation.



VALUES AND ETHICS

Launched "Specialized Mentoring" and received acclaim from counties, courts and special advocates.

Integrated the principles of "Cowboy Ethics" into the STORY program and the specialized mentoring process.

Responded to requests for services from day treatment and residential centers via Daniels Fund grant funding.



SCHOOLS AND EDUCATION

Continued providing animal-assisted services to high-risk children at Glennon Heights Elementary School.

Offered the STORY program to high-risk freshmen at Wheat Ridge High School via donor support.



ANIMALS AND NATURE

Provided animal-assisted therapy to four counties and achieved great feedback regarding its impact.

Offered *Pawsitive Connection* classes to alternative schools and day treatment centers.

Collaborated with Colorado Youth Outdoors in providing outdoor education opportunities at our Thunderbird Ranch mountain site.

Helping all youth, parents and families manage the stresses, confusion and trends in our society.




Cover the gap - actual costs vs. reimbursement

- Privately fund an expansion of services to children/families not involved in child welfare or juvenile justice systems.
- Expand our Specialized Mentoring services.
- Expand animal-assisted services to meet a growing number of requests from elementary schools.
- Expand our support to adoptive families and youth waiting for adoption.
