

COMPETENCY OUTPATIENT RESTORATION EDUCATION

The Competency Outpatient Restoration Education (ORE) program provided in partnership with Colorado Department of Human Services and the Office of Behavioral Health is a brand new program in CBRYC's service array. ORE is designed for youth who have a criminal charge



- within the juvenile justice system. The program's goal is to help youth learn rational decision making skills, gain an understanding of their criminal charges, and learn about the basic proceedings of the court and how it pertains to them.
- Already, CBRYC is setting an example through this program and has set the state standard for competency education of youth.

CONNECTIONS BUILD RESILIENCE HOME-BASED PROGRAM



The Connections Build Resilience Home-Based (CBR-HB) program has elevated our previous home-based program to incorporate three evidenced-based modalities, Trauma Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, Trust Based Relational Intervention, Motivational Interviewing.

CBR-HB Clinicians offer structure, support, supervision, and evidenced-based interventions within in the home, at school and in the community for youth and family issues.





Being a teenager in foster care is never easy. Kevin entered CBR YouthConnect's *Specialized*Mentoring program 3 years ago during a very rough time in his life. He had lost his dad at a young age, his adoptive parents had relinquished their rights after parenting him for several years, and he had entered foster care once again. He had cut off all ties with his family and was feeling lost and alone. He was shy, quiet, and stayed in his room most of the day.

Through the encouragement of his mentor and the prosocial activities they did during sessions, Kevin slowly learned to open up and pursue his own interests. He has learned that he loves to make other people laugh and that he is a really caring person.
